### The Maule Tailwheel Training Award

The Maule Tailwheel Training Award provides a 99s member with ten (10) hours tailwheel flight training at Maule Flight, Inc., in Moultrie, Georgia, USA, with an estimated value of US\$1700. Requirements: For a one-year 99s Member who is a current pilot, but with no prior tailwheel experience. Must be a U.S. citizen and have the financial ability to pay for travel, food, and lodging expenses during training. Must be willing to spread the word on the joys of tailwheel flying to the aviation community.

The Maule Tailwheel Training Award is donated by Maule Air, Inc., manufacturer of the rugged, simple and reliable Maule aircraft, a four-place, high-wing monoplane taildragger with STOL (short field takeoff and landing) characteristics for flying on wheels, floats, or skis.

Training will be provided by Maule Flight, Inc., a Part 61 flight school located just down the ramp from the Maule factory at Spence Field in Moultrie, GA. Maule Flight is located at Spence Field (KMUL) near Moultrie, GA, which is approximately 50 miles Northeast of Tallahassee, FL, and about 250 miles from Atlanta.

### APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. **MEMBERSHIP:** Applicant must be a Member of The Ninety-Nines, Inc., and been so continuously since April 1, 2007. *NOTE: Length of membership may include time as Future Woman Pilot Member.*
2. **COMMUNITY OUTREACH:** Applicant must be willing to spread the word on the joys of tailwheel flying to the aviation community.
3. **PILOT QUALIFICATIONS:** Applicant must meet these requirements at time of application:
  - a) **RATED PILOT:** Applicant must hold an FAA Private Pilot or higher grade pilot certificate.
  - b) **MEDICAL CERTIFICATE:** Applicant must possess current, valid medical certificate of the class corresponding to pilot certificate held.
  - c) **CURRENCY:** At time of application, applicant must be current and qualified as pilot, i.e., current flight review, competency or proficiency check, or equivalent. *NOTE: Landing / instrument currency not required.*
  - d) **FLIGHT EXPERIENCE:** Applicant must have NO previous tailwheel flight experience as pilot.
4. **CITIZENSHIP:** Applicant must be a U.S. citizen (Maule Flight is unable to make immigration and security arrangements for non-U.S. citizen flight students).
5. **FINANCIAL ABILITY:** Applicant must have the financial ability to pay for travel, food, and lodging expenses during training at Maule Flight, Inc. in Moultrie, Georgia.
6. **APPLICATION:** The Maule Tailwheel Training Award application is the mechanism by which the applicant states her scholarship request. The applicant is responsible for ensuring that the application is complete and true in every respect – omission of required information or providing fraudulent information is grounds for disqualification and withdrawal of scholarship.

**No Applicant Eligibility Requirements or deadlines may be waived.**

**Disqualification will result from not meeting eligibility requirements or following procedures.**

**INCOMPLETE, LATE, or FRAUDULENT applications will be DISQUALIFIED.**

## APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS

1. The Maule Tailwheel Training Award provides ten (10) hours tailwheel flight training at Maule Flight, Inc., in Moultrie, Georgia, USA, with an estimated value of US\$1700. Travel / food / lodging not included.
2. Application must be submitted on 8½ x 11 paper and be neat and legible in English. It may be completed by computer, typewriter, or by hand, but all signatures must be in ink pen – electronic or typed signatures not allowed. Indicate “N/A” for “not applicable.” Use more space or attach extra page to relevant Part, if needed.
3. Verify and establish positive contact with your Section AE Scholarship Chairman, using the online directory. If none, it is your Section Governor. (Members-at-Large: it is the International President.) **Chapter Members:** Verify and establish positive contact with your Chapter AE Scholarship Chairman. If none, it is your Chapter Chairman. **Verify the submission deadline for your chapter.**
4. **Chapter Members:** It is the Applicant’s responsibility to request 99s Recommendation from her chapter. Submit completed application **by the deadline specified by your chapter**. The complete application package to be submitted to your chapter consists of the Application Parts I-VII including documentation (the 99s Certification and Recommendation will be blank). Provide Cover Sheet and one copy of Applicant Eligibility Requirements, Applicant Instructions, and AE Scholarship Chairman Instructions & Checklist. If you are recommended by your chapter, obtain original application with completed 99s Certification and Recommendation for submission to Section.
5. **ALL Applicants:** You are responsible for submitting complete application package to your Section AE Scholarship Chairman, or if none, to your Section Governor. (Members-at-Large: Submit to International President.) Submit original Application Parts I-VII including documentation – for Chapter Members, the 99s Certification and Recommendation must be completed. Submit one original, keep one copy. **Submit it so that she will receive it by the deadline of APRIL 1, 2008.**
6. Applicant is responsible for ensuring that application package is complete in every respect. Staple or clip pages – do not use any type of binder or cover. Make a copy of your complete application and retain for your records.
7. Applicant is responsible for following instructions, meeting all deadlines, and tracking the progress of her application through the review and selection process. Use Applicant Checklist and follow up at every step.
8. **ALL SHIPMENTS:** Submit one original, keep one copy. Send in a single, trackable shipment. Retain shipment tracking number and receipt. United Parcel Service is our preferred shipping provider.
9. Winners will be notified by MAY 1, 2008 and must complete training by JUNE 30, 2009.
