Flying Treasure Hunt

1. Check our website www.orgsites/me/KatahdinWings;
download a registration form
2. Pay the \$35 registration – funds support The 99s aviation
education and outreach activities
3. Dig out your sectional and plot the hunting territory by
the long/lats given
4. The clues will be emailed the night before the Hunt begins.
5. Solve the clues (think crossword puzzle type clues). The
answers will be found on the sectional, but are not always
visible on the ground
6. There is a 3-week window of time to solve the clues then
fly to and photograph your answers (the “Treasures”)
7. Compile your answers and photos and send in to the
Treasure Hunt Judge as soon as possible. Time entries are
received help determine winners if there are multiple
participants with the same correct answers.
